

RE Service Project Requirement for Confirmation:

Four (4) Service Project Reflection Forms



Christ asks us to be His hands, feet, and eyes.

In preparation for the reception of Confirmation, you are expected to participate in four (4) different acts of service. Four Service Project Reflection forms must be filled out and turned into the RE Office to complete this requirement. You should select deeds that are geared toward your own special talents and abilities. If you are serving the same project over multiple days it is still considered ONE (1) act of service (for example only 1 act of service should come from Girl/Boy Scouts, 1 for helping at the library, 1 for helping with a sports team, 1 for helping set-up a classroom/office work, 1 for babysitting a neighbor free of charge, 1 for shoveling an elderly person's driveway, etc.). Each service project should reflect one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Service should reflect work done beyond the usual chores and duties required at home. **The service cannot have financial rewards.** We recommend that each candidate perform an act of service with their sponsor and/or parent. Projects that require a greater commitment may be counted as 2 acts of service. **To get credit for 2 acts, it must be preapproved by DRE & you will still need to turn in 2 Service Project Reflections.**
